August 26, 2015**

**Public Meeting #2 Summary**

The second public meeting for the Pace Pulse Milwaukee Line project was held on Wednesday, August 26, 2015, at the Copernicus Center, 5216 W Lawrence Ave, Chicago, Illinois from 5:30–7:30 p.m. A media briefing took place at 5:00 p.m. The meeting was an open house format with a continuous audio-visual presentation, exhibit boards for review, large scale aerials of the project area and station locations, and a comment area for attendees to provide comments, suggestions, issues, and concerns. Program team members were available to discuss the Pulse service and answer questions. Attendees were encouraged to submit their comments via the comment form as well as write down their comments on adhesive notes and place them on the aerial map of the corridor.

The meeting was **attended by 35 people, including 5 media representatives**. Attendees submitted **6 comment forms and 7 additional comments were placed on the aerial maps**. In addition, **one comment was submitted via the Pulse website**.
